The problem, Poudrier stated, stems largely from a lack of services and public awareness.

“(This) creates and constitutes what I would submit is a very real danger for the community in the form of dangerous animals who are uncared for and then therefore forced to care for themselves,”

he said. “They become virile and wild.

“The problem becomes compounded further and becomes cyclical at the same time because there really are no services available, and the cycle continues to repeat itself. Aside from that, the situation is fundamentally cruel as the uncontrolled reproduction of these animals produces animals that no one really cares for.”
